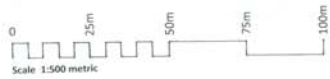

- 23 EXISTING WOODS THINNED FOR VISIBILITY
- 24 CREEKSIDE HABITAT EXTENDED AS AN INTERPRETIVE ZONE
- 25 CREEK CHANNEL REGRADED AND REPAIRED AS REQUIRED
- 26 MAIN NORTH-SOUTH PATHWAY PARALLELS CREEK
- 27 EXISTING CLEARING PLANTED TO WILDFLOWERS
- 28 VEHICULAR REVERSING POINT IF NO ACCESS THROUGH '29'
- 29 PEDESTRIAN AND SERVICE ACCESS
- 30 ROAD CROSSING IF TRAIL CONTINUES SOUTHWARD
